


The Hive Book Hook Week Beginning: 27th April, 2020

Harry and the Bucketful of Dinosaurs

Personal and social development

- Think about something you take care of. How do you look after these things?
- Think of a game to play with your favourite dinosaur or teddy.
- Make a safe place for your special dinosaur or teddy to sleep.

Communication and Language

- Make stick puppets of the characters from the story. Retell the story to someone in your family.
- Imagine you have found a box in the attic. What is inside? Draw and label pictures.
- Think of your own adventure with Harry and the dinosaurs. Role play your story.

Physical Development

- Draw and cut out dinosaur footprints.
- Make an obstacle course in your garden for you and your dinosaurs (or teddies!) Time yourself and then try and beat your time.
- Use string and dried pasta to make a necklace for Harry.

Literacy

- Think of your own dinosaur adventure. Draw the story in a picture board. Add some words and sentences.
- Read some non-fiction books on dinosaurs.
- Draw and label your favourite dinosaurs. You could make a dinosaur fact file!
- Make a dinosaur dictionary.

Mathematics

- Count how many dinosaurs you have at home!
- Make dinosaur footprint number cards up to 20.
 Make number lines forwards and backwards. Hide these in the garden and then put them in order
- Put your dinosaurs in order of size

Knowledge and Understanding of the World

- Find out interesting facts about dinosaurs.
- Make a dinosaur timeline.
- How do dinosaurs move? Make a short video of your favourite dinosaur moves!
- Visit the Natural History Museum website and take a virtual tour.

Expressive Art and Design

- Make a different container for Harry to put his dinosaurs in.
- Draw or paint a new kind of dinosaur.
- Listen to the theme tune for the TV show Harry and his bucketful of Dinosaurs. Sing along and use body percussion to keep the rhythm.
- Make up your own dinosaur song or rap.
