
Class book: The Last Castaways Class 2 Term 3 2020/21 Spring Term 2021



As **Scientists** we will exploring the different states of matter and how materials can be either gas, liquid, or a solid. We be developing 'working scientifically' by hypothesising, estimating, undertaking experiments, discussing our finding, and concluding out learning.

As **Design Technologists** we will working with a variety of textiles to create products that the children can use. The children will be marking out fabric, cutting fabric, sewing (assisted), and attaching simple features like buttons.

As **Artists** we will be making prints with paint. These prints will be reflective of our topic (History), and will also follow our class book. The children will be creating different prints and will be experimenting by creating stamps.

As **Historians** we will be revisiting the Roman empire to explore Roman artefacts including clothing, housing, and pottery. We will be using maps and other historical resources to understand how the Roman empire impacted life in Britain.

## **ENGLISH**

In English we will be using our class book 'The Last Castaways' as the focal point to write fact files and non-chronological reports. Later in the term we will also be writing creative stories.

In reading, we will be delving into 'The Last Castaways' exploring the plot and building on our reading comprehension.

Throughout the term we will also be focusing on handwriting and improving the children's use of their spellings within their work.
