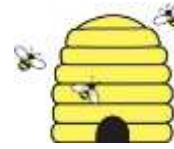


# Kempsford Church of England Primary School

## **Book Hook**

This term we are focussing our learning around the book *The Butterfly Lion* by Michael Morpurgo. The book focuses on Bertie who rescues an orphaned white lion from the African grassland just outside his home. They are inseparable until Bertie is sent away to boarding school and the white lion is sold to a circus. Bertie endeavours to find the lion but it is the butterfly lion who ensures their friendship continues. The book provides many opportunities to discuss our value of Friendship.
