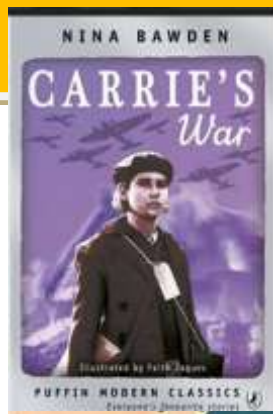

Key Areas of Learning

This term we will be using the book, 'Carrie's war' to engage learners and spark conversation in other areas of the curriculum.

Using aspects discussed in the book we will break down times and key events from world war two and investigate our local area for signs we can still see from this period.

All of class three will take part in swimming lessons on a Tuesday afternoon at Cirencester leisure centre. Swimming is part of a statutory requirement for learners in Key Stage 2 before moving to secondary school and is taught by qualified teachers at the centre

ENGLISH

In English we will be using the book 'Carrie's War' to develop discussion and ideas around the time period of the world war. As part of this we will be writing newspaper reports and diaries and analyzing key pieces from the period such as extracts from Anne Frank.

MATHEMATICS

In Mathematics we will be looking at decimals and percentages along with fractions.

Many of the aspects we will look at require learners to look for patterns and links to previous learning which is supported by homework set on MyMaths.

SCIENCE

In Science we will be looking at conducting and writing investigations with an emphasis on independence and our formulation of conclusions.

MUSIC

We will be looking at music production and how this is done.

PE

In PE we will be looking at athletics and learners in KS2 will have an opportunity to represent the school.
