Class 3 had a virtual author workshop with Lisa Wakely. They learnt how to create suspense in character descriptions and plot out exciting story ideas.

World Book Day was a great success with many fantastic characters walking through the door. The staff entertained the children with their version of Aliens Love Underpants! The day was spent carrying out activities linked to literacy.



This week we are involved in a sponsored Readathon. Classes will be spending 30 minutes a day reading for pleasure. Any money raised provides books and storytellers to all of the UK's major children's hospitals and funds projects encouraging children to read for fun.

As part of science week all classes are invited to attend an Animals VR session tomorrow. The workshop includes plenty of curriculum points across the school from 'Living Things and Their Habitats' and 'Animals' objectives such as classification, camouflage, diet and habitat, teeth and adaptation.

Tomorrow is also the last clarinet session for Class 3. We invite parents to attend a short concert at 2:45pm where children will perform what they have learnt.
