Literacy

In Literacy, we will be focusing on creating a persuasive advert about eco-friendly straws. The children will take part in a range of engaging lessons, including exploring persuasive language, identifying key features of adverts, and discussing environmental issues to inspire their ideas. We will continue to practise our handwriting daily to support presentation and clarity.



PE- Outdoor adventurous activities

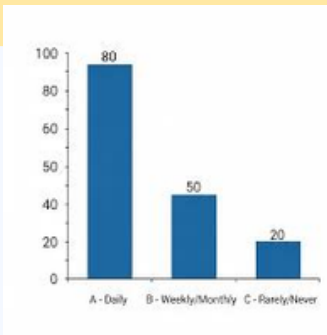
The children will participate in a variety of team building games. They will focus on running fast, throwing for distance, jumping for distance, obstacle course. Run, jump, throw challenges.

PSHE

In PSHE, we will be focusing on healthy eating and making positive choices. We will learn about the importance of a balanced diet and how different foods help our bodies to grow, stay active, and remain healthy. The children will explore how to make sensible food choices for meals and snacks, and understand the benefits of moderation. We will also discuss how habits, lifestyle, and daily routines can support overall wellbeing.

Art

In Art, we will be focusing on tones and shades. The children will explore how to use light and dark to create depth and form in their artwork. They will experiment with different techniques, such as blending and layering, to develop a range of tones using a variety of media.

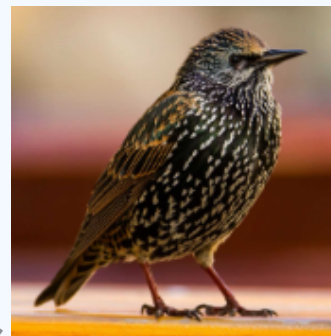


History

As historians, we will be learning about the Ancient Mayans. We will explore who the Mayans were and where they lived, as well as understanding the structure of their society. The children will learn about key aspects of Mayan life, including their achievements in writing, mathematics, and architecture. We will also investigate their beliefs and traditions, and identify what we can learn about the past from different sources of evidence.

Mathematics

In Mathematics, we will be learning about money. The children will develop their understanding of different coins and notes, and learn how to make amounts in different ways. They will practise adding and subtracting money, as well as solving real-life problems involving costs and change.

Science

As scientists, we will be investigating sound and vibrations. We will identify how sounds are made and understand that vibrations travel through different materials to reach our ears. The children will explore how pitch and volume can change and the factors that affect them. We will carry out practical investigations to observe how vibrations create sound and how it travels through solids, liquids, and gases.

French

We will be learning about places around the town. The children will explore key locations such as shops, parks, and public buildings, and learn how to describe them.

Music

As musicians, singing and listening are at the heart of each of our lessons. We will learn to play, improvise and compose using a selection of these notes: C, D, E, F, F#, G, G#, A, Bs. Through regular practice and group work, we will build confidence in performing both individually and as part of an ensemble.



Computing

In Computing, we will be learning how to gather data. The children will explore different ways to collect information, including surveys and simple observations. They will learn how to organise and record their data clearly, using a range of digital tools.
