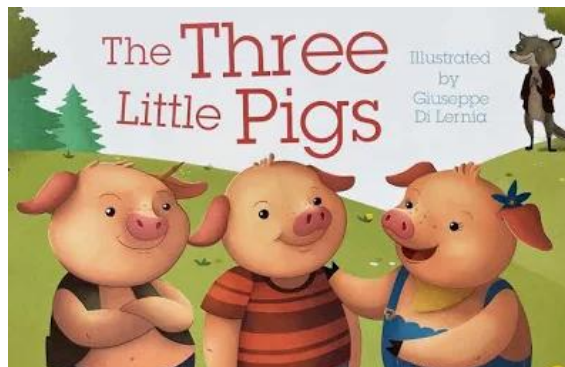


# Pick and Mix Term 5



<p style="text-align: center;"><b><u>Creative Development</u></b></p> <p>Puppet show. Create your own characters. Use old socks, wooden spoons or even just finger drawings to make the three pigs and the wolf. Act out the 'Huff and Puff' scene with plenty of silly voices.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b><u>Personal, Social, Emotional Development</u></b></p> <p>Safe and sound. Talk about what makes the pigs feel safe in the brick house?</p> <p>Draw a picture of your own home and talk about who lives there and why it is safe, happy place. How do you think the pigs felt when the wolf was at the door?</p>
<p style="text-align: center;"><b><u>Physical Development</u></b></p> <p>The big blow. Set up a 'wind race'. Place a cotton ball (the straw house), a LEGO brick (the stick house) and a heavy stone (the brick house) on a table.</p> <p>See how hard you must blow to move each one.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b><u>Knowledge and Understanding of the World</u></b></p> <p>Go for a walk or look around your garden. Can you find something made from straw (dried grass), sticks (twigs), and bricks (walls) Touch then and talk about how they feel. Which one is the strongest? Why doesn't the wolf use a hairdryer instead of his breath?</p>
<p style="text-align: center;"><b><u>Reading and Writing</u></b></p> <p>Wanted Poster. Create a 'WANTED' poster. Ask your child to describe the wolf. Reception can label the picture. (big ears, sharp teeth etc.)</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b><u>Maths- Number, Shape, Space and measure</u></b></p> <p>Building by numbers. Use blocks or cardboard boxes to build the tree houses. Count how many 'bricks' it takes to make a sturdy wall. Try to find shapes around the house that look like the pigs' houses- is the roof a triangle? Is the door a rectangle?</p>
